Our Lives Touch One Last Time...

The weather was beautiful and the air was full of excitement as we crossed over the Cowlitz River and into the Gearheart Gardens Dog Park parking lot-- our staging area where we convoyed to the Longview-Kelso Fairgrounds to enjoy the hospitality of Kathy and Andy Belough and staff of FMCA's "Blast from the Past" rally. Not a huge rally, but for what hardships that our clubs are dealing with regarding attendance, it was pretty good; about 325 coaches. As a club, we made a sizeable number of 11 coaches and welcomed new members Jerry & Sharen Work from Kerby, OR. We look forward to enjoying their company at future rallies. Mike Spong made this his first rally since joining our club last year. He's the son of Bill Spong and Juanita, one of my favorite couples that I have enjoyed over the years. They have both passed now, but their bus "The Lady" big green machine, still looks great.

The way Longview and Kelso intertwine; I could have played the role of Forrest Gump, starring Gary Chatterton, running from town to town. That's right, I could have zig-zagged back & forth and in just a few blocks, I could have left one town and entered another in just a few strides. What a cute area.

I would like to share a real life story with you. My dad's mother (my grandmother) lived in Longview, and that's where dad grew up. He quit school at a young age to find a job in a local plywood plant, along with a few of his close friends. While working in the plant, he was given a nickname of "shrimp"; apparently he had a small structure. Dad and his buddies met an older immigrant who worked with them. He had his own place and car, so the young guys would hang out at his place. He was old enough to purchase alcohol; what a plus for the younger ones. Over the coming years, everyone grew older and went their separate ways.

I can remember at a young grade school age, we would, on occasion drive to Longview to visit with my grandmother. Dad would always leave to search for his old immigrant friend, but was never successful. It was as if he never existed. It was a sad tale for my dad, as they must have had a real connection. This took place for me in the early fifties.

Now let's fast forward to January 1983. For years, every Sunday morning I went to Sandy Barrs Flea Market here in Portland. Often, my dad and brother would drive in from St. Helens/Warren to meet up with me at the flea market. There was a small coffee snack counter at the armory where the flea market was held. Well, dad went up to have a cup of coffee and sit a spell. My whole family is very social and doesn't know a stranger. As dad sipped at his coffee, he overheard the conversation that was going on at the table he shared. Dad heard a name coming from the other end of the table that he inquired about his whole adult life that he was unable to track down. The name Santangalo rang out in dad's ears. Was this a miracle? Read on and let me know if it touches you as much as it does me every time I tell this true life story that I am connected to. Dad spoke to that little old shriveled up man and said "Do you know of an Ernesto Santangelo that lived in Longview, Washington? He replied "I am Ernesto". Dad in return said " Do you remember "Shrimp"? They spent a lifetime searching each other out. I was introduced to this man that had such an impact on my father's life.

"The Plan": Next Sunday mom was to come with dad to the flea market, meet "the man" and share a lasting friendship. Ernesto was a regular at Sandy Barrs Flea Market, but our first meeting would be our last. He was old and feeble and weak and ill. This would be the last time the Chatterton family would see this wonderful old gentleman. Dad died January 1983 and was put to rest at Willamette National Cemetery in Happy Valley, Oregon, just blocks from my home. Every year before Memorial Day, I take my scrub brush, cleaner and grass clippers to my family and friends burial plots and clean and trim the headstones.

This next line is line is like Paul Harvey's "The rest of the story". After cleaning and trimming my dad's headstone, I was walking to my car and four rows below my dad's plot directly in line, I spotted a familiar name. Can you guess whose it might be? That's right. Ernesto Santangalo. It was as though these two men, who had a short time of their lives as fellow workers in a plywood plant and shared a friendship, spent the rest of the lives to reunite before they met their maker. Even though I only met this man once, that had such an impact. He has been put on my "to do" list for Memorial Day cleanup.

In a way, I can relate to this story as we look forward to meeting up with our friends at upcoming rallies. Not to this degree, but all of us enjoy the camaraderie that welcomes us at each and every rally.

I and your fellow board members are working hard to keep our club strong and enjoyable. We invite people to join and enjoy, have fun and eat well. You know it gets harder every day and we all need help to accomplish these tasks. We need members to step and help out putting on rallies. The last few years, it has been the same few that are hosting our rallies. We need new blood. Please contact my (503) 816-5782 or one of your other board members to help your club. Thanks to all that volunteered and helped out in the past and in the future. Check out our rally schedule and plan on participating.

In September, we will be at Mt. Angel to join in the celebration of Octoberfest. We, as a club have enjoyed this location many times in the past. Everyone has had a great experience over the years; some have even participated in dance and song. (After visiting the beer garden they danced a lot better!) 
We don't have any plans for August. If you would like to put something together, call your vice-presidents Al Roeske (541) 954-0676 or John Shierman (360)253-1526.
